WHAT IS CONCURRENT EDUCATION?

CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT THROUGH CASC ALLOWS HIGH SCHOOL JUNIORS AND SENIORS THE OPPORTUNITY TO ENROLL IN AND EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WHILE STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL.

students who take concurrent classes enroll in college after high school graduation, compared to less than 30% who do not take concurrent classes.



Juniors will receive a tuition waiver for up to 12 credit hours to be used during the Fall, and/or Spring Semester. Seniors will receive a tuition waiver for up to 18 credit hours to be used during any combination of the Summer, Fall, and/or Spring Semester.

Students will be responsible to pay for Fees, Books, and any tuition that is taken over the waiver amount.

COMPARETHECOSTS

A 3 Credit hour course at a regional university like NSU or UAFS costs around \$700 for a first time freshman, A concurrent student will pay approximately \$175.00 (fees only) to take a course at CASC. That is a cost savings of \$525 - It saves a lot of money to take concurrent classes



OUR CREDITS TRANSFER

Our courses at CASC are transferable to just about any school that the student is interested in attending. Visit with the high school counselor, look at transfer tables on our website, or contact one of our advisors at CASC to see how courses will transfer.

POSSIBLE DUAL CREDIT

Take one course and get dual credit at high school and college level. Check with your high school counselor in advance of enrollment to see if your school offers dual enrollment for college courses.
